Capital Improvements

If you visited **Camp Li-Wa** this summer, you may have noticed the facilities straining to keep up with the number of campers. It's exciting that registrations have doubled in the last five years, but the aging infrastructure limits future expansion and is insufficient for daily demands. By afternoon on a typical summer day, one building after another loses water pressure and staff must juggle

shower and dishwashing schedules. To address these challenges, a new well

was dug this summer. In 2025, work projects will include constructing a water storage building, building a wastewater treatment site, and installing new underground water and sewer mains. These improvements are crucial for daily camping operations. Water infrastructure is also the next major step for the new lodge/dining hall project.

We are grateful for a productive 2024 season: the completion of electrical grid upgrades, the addition of urethane foam insulation to the new lodge, and the construction of the wood boiler building, and a new outdoor riding arena.

Victory Bible Camp continues to draw campers from the Mat-Su Valley and the wider Anchorage area. Program expansion and facility upgrades are looking to keep up with growth trends and continue to maximize discipleship opportunities. Alpine was a focus this year with a remodel that created a dormitory for the S.A.L.T. program. This fall, staff members moved a cabin to make room for a new campfire area closer to Alpine Lodge - this will facilitate spiritual conversations. The retaining wall that supports the road and Alpine Lodge needs to be replaced in 2025 - materials have already been donated. The gym underwent upgrades to enhance sound quality and accommodate more campers during chapel service. A work team completed roof repairs

on Miracle Lodge in record time and used the remaining days to construct new picnic tables for the RV area. Prior to next summer, a walled tent on a platform will be added to Ranch Camp for boys' housing This will create more available housing for girl campers. Each week of horse camp had a waitlist, and some weeks had more campers on the waitlist than those who were registered.

Whenever children remain on a waitlist, that is a lost opportunity for them to hear the gospel or grow in their faith. The ministry at Victory Bible Camp is growing. What is your role? Might you give or volunteer a portion of your summer for these important projects? There are openings for work teams at Victory Bible Camp for May and August.

UPHOLDING THE MISSION

ow does Victory Ministries make disciples for Jesus Christ? It is through intentional conversations with campers and strategic discipleship programs like Li-Wa 365 and Outpost. It's also through being a servant to others, whether children or adults, in the daily interactions that make up camp life. This year, discipleship has looked like sharing late-night spiritual conversations with work team members over graham crackers and peanut butter, reorganizing a workspace to invite spiritual conversations over coffee, counseling with a young woman while stacking wood, and praying for each visitor to the camp properties.

GOD BRINGS THE HARVEST



We're thrilled to share the summer impact of Camp Li-Wa and Victory Bible Camp's programs. At Li-Wa, 39 campers embraced salvation, and many others rededicated their lives to Christ. Victory Bible Camp witnessed 101 young people transformed as they accepted Christ and 108 rededications.

Behind these numbers are powerful stories of transformation. For instance, a troubled camper at Victory Bible Camp found faith after several weeks of attendance. She experienced God's grace through compassionate leadership. At Camp Li-Wa, a young boy finally committed his life to Christ this summer after six consecutive summers. Another long-time camper, who has not yet believed,


returns multiple times each summer, saying, "Save my spot." At home, he faces many challenges, and camp has become a refuge. Summer camping



programs and yearround discipleship initiatives may take years to bear fruit. We are reminded that some plant the seed, others water – but God causes all of them to grow!

For example, one church recently rescheduled a mission trip so that students would be free to attend summer camp orientation. Young people who have faithfully served in Christian camping are better prepared for ministry in their local churches - sober-minded and mature. This is, in fact, how it should be. New Opportunities

In 2024, Victory Bible Camp introduced Wilderness Camp, offering two sessions - a sea kayaking trip out of Whittier, Alaska, and a backpacking trip to hike Noyes Mountain, the highest peak in the Mentasta Mountains. Wilderness Camp invites young people to push their limits, experience adventure, and disconnect from everyday distractions to connect more deeply with their Creator. Wilderness Camp attracts campers who might not otherwise attend a traditional camp. There are plans to expand it into a summer-long program of 5-7 sessions.

In the six years that Victory Ministries has been battling this in the courts, many Fairbanks nonprofits have come under similar pressure from the assessor's office. The financial impact has been significant – and we are grateful for the Lord's provision. Please pray that the Lord will work in the hearts of borough authorities and State lawmakers to bring a favorable resolution.

Capital Improvements. Please pray for wisdom as we plan upgrades and repairs to ensure our facilities remain safe, functional, and supportive of our mission to make disciples through Christian camping for future generations.
